

Background

Chile, Mexico and Canada are all signatories to the Paris Agreement, members of the Carbon Pricing Leadership Coalition (CPLC), and each implementing carbon pricing schemes.

The Paris Agreement (article 6) broadly outlines the cooperative approaches that parties may use in achieving their nationally determined contributions (NDC).

The Agreement recognizes the rights of Parties to use emissions reductions outside of their own jurisdiction toward their NDC, in a system of global carbon markets.

This workshop is meant to explore how international transfer of mitigation outcomes (ITMOs) could function, including methodology for projects currently being planned in Chile (waste management sector) and Mexico (oil and gas sector) for implementation over the next 4 years.
